During the Euro Squash Tour, the players will be completely immersed in squash for two weeks. Squash is a game that requires equally strong body and mind and that's why, during the training sessions, they will practice their technique, work on their physical conditioning and develop their game strategy and mental skills. It's a great opportunity for them to experience the different coaching styles of some of Europe's best coaches.

While playing the Pioneer Junior Open and the Dutch Junior Open, your kids will have the opportunity to play amongst the top juniors in the world. Competing with international players will give them a different view of the game. It will expose them to a new level of skills, to different game strategies and to mentally strong young players. They will experience squash in a whole new way, which will evolve their game and make them mentally stronger. After playing these massive tournaments, a simple competition in the U.S. will seem ordinary. The Tournaments

The Pioneer Junior Open 2014

The Pioneer Junior Open will take place from July 3rd to July 7th in the ACR Sports Center (http://acr-sportcenter.eu) in Cologne, Germany. This amazing sports club, with over 11,000m² and 15 high-quality ASB squash courts, offers a handful of sports-related entertaining, such as tennis, badminton, table tennis, soccer, basketball, as well as a sauna and a restaurant. This amazing facility hosts the Pioneer Junior Open, one of the most important junior tournaments in Europe. Some of the top-ranked pro squash players in the world have played

this tournament in their junior years. The players will be able to meet and compete with the best juniors in Europe, which will expose them to a different view of the game.

The Dutch Junior Open 2014

The Dutch Junior Open will take place from July 9th to July 13th in Amsterdam, the Netherlands. The venue for this year's tournament hasn't been yet confirmed, but in past years it took place in Frans Otten Stadion (http://www.fransottenstadion.nl), in South Amsterdam. This sports facility has 21 squash courts, including a three-side glass-walled court surrounded by bleachers that accommodate 1,500 spectators. This massive sports club also offers tennis courts, fitness center, a bar and a restaurant. If confirmed as the 2014 venue for the Dutch Junior Open, it would be a great



opportunity for the kids to play one of the most important junior tournaments in Europe in a facility that meets the requirements to host major international squash tournaments.

It's important to highlight that both tournaments are run on the MONRAD System, which provides players with continuous matches. Players are not eliminated from the tournament, but rather continue to play matches until a final ranking is established. All players are guaranteed minimum of 3 matches.



Our Training Facility

The training sessions before the tournaments will be held at Racket Centrum Houten, in the Netherlands. This racquet club has six squash

courts, 7 clay outdoor tennis courts and 8 hard-floor indoor tennis courts, as well as a restaurant, where healthy meals are specially prepared for the athletes.

The club is run by Marijn Koot, a former top ranked squash player in the Netherlands and currently

one of the best squash coaches in the Netherlands. He will oversee the players' training and pay special attention to the development of their mental skills, since he is specialized in sports psychology.

The practice will consist in physical conditioning, technique/tactic practice, game strategy and mental coaching, as squash is both a physical and mental game.



The Destinations

Houten

Houten is a town located about 9km southeast of Utrecht. This town, with about 49,000 inhabitants, is famous by its traffic structure. If the Netherlands is heaven for the bikers, then Houten is the heaven of heaven. In Houten there are more bikes than people and about 26 percent of the commuting trips are taken by bicycle. The likelihood of getting injured in a bike accident in Houten is amongst the lowest in the world, about five times less than in the United States.

The players will be based in Houten, where the Racket Centrum is located. The hotel, Van Der Valk Houten Hotel (http://www.hotelhouten.nl/en/), is located just a few minutes from the squash club. The players will head by rental bikes to the training sessions, as a healthy warm-up and a form of interaction with the Dutch culture.





Utrecht

Utrecht is the Netherlands' fourth biggest city and has been described by Lonely Planet magazine as one of the 10 world's unsung places. The city was built on

the foundations left by the Roman Empire and its ancient city center features many buildings and structures from the Early Middle Ages. Utrecht's old town is encircled by a medieval canal, and it is possible to hop on a boat tour to visit the city's bustling, vibrant wharves, which are filled with

bohemian cafes, shops and restaurants.

Utrecht is host to Utrecht University, the largest university of the Netherlands, as well as several other institutes for higher education. It has the second highest number of cultural events in the Netherlands, after Amsterdam, and will be the players' destination for sightseeing and entertaining during their free time.

Amsterdam

Few cities meld history with modern urban flair like Amsterdam. What makes Amsterdam so attractive is the 17th century historical atmosphere combined with the mentality of a modern metropolis creating a friendly and relaxed environment. The small scale of the buildings and the intimacy of the streets, canals and squares create an


atmosphere that visitors find unique. The city has the highest museum density in the world and

is home to cultural highlights, such as the Van Gogh Museum, Anne Frank House, Hermitage Amsterdam and the Rijksmuseum with Rembrandt's world-famous Nightwatch.

Amsterdam, which is located only 30 minutes away from Houten, will be our destination on the second part of the trip, as it hosts the Dutch Junior Open. The players will be based in one of the hotels recommended by the tournament organizers and will commute to the tournament venue by shuttle buses. In their free time, the players will be able to do some sightseeing and cultural visits to Amsterdam, always under the coach's supervision.



Cologne



Cologne, which lies on the banks of the river Rhine, was founded by Romans in 38 bC and is one of Germany's oldest cities. This city was heavily damaged in the World War II, when 90% of the city center was wiped out by bombings. Today, Cologne is again the fourth biggest city in Germany with over a million inhabitants and an interesting mix of restored historic buildings and modern post-war architecture. Cologne is famous for its massive cathedral, the Kolner Dom, and one of Europe's oldest universities, as well as its vibrant contemporary art scene. The city is proud to have more than 30 museums and 100 galleries with world-class collections.

Located about 2 hours away from Houten, Cologne will host the Pioneer Junior Open. The players will be based in this city during the tournament, in one of the hotels recommended by the tournament organizers. A bus

transfer service will be available for the commute to the tournament's venue. In their free time, the players will enjoy Cologne and do some sightseeing, under the supervision of the coach.

The tour price does not include:

- Medical expenses;
- Extra hotel charges, like phone calls or laundry;
- Souvenirs, snacks and drinks.

Other information:

- The trip requires a minimum of 3 (three) participants. If this minimum is not achieved until the deadline (June 1st) the trip will be cancelled and the package fee will be refunded.
- It is highly recommended that the players arrange international health insurance for the extent of the trip. Euro Squash Tour will not be responsible for any medical expenses;
- The travelers will need pocket money for snacks, drinks, souvenirs and any other expenses not included in the tour price;
- The success of past trips was a result of a zero-tolerance policy for drinking, smoking or any bad behavior on and off courts. In case any of these situations happen, parents will be directly contacted and arrangements will be made to send the player home. Euro Squash Tour will not be responsible for any damages to hotel rooms, sports facilities or equipments caused by the players.

Cancellation policy:

Due to the tournament and hotel's cancellation policies, the package fees cannot be refunded for any cancellations on or after June 27th, 2014. For cancellations between June 16th and June 26th (inclusive), only 50% of the package fee is refundable. Cancellation of flight tickets will depend on the airline's cancellation policy.
